TQG Quilt Show June 7 – 8, 2024

All quilts which have been registered for our show will be collected on either Saturday June 1st from 11:30 am – 1:00 pm at the Saturday chapter venue, Harvest Assembly Church, 525 Kempsville Rd, Chesapeake, 2332 or Sunday June 2nd from 1:00 pm – 3:00 pm at Wycliffe Presbyterian Church, 1445 N Great Neck Rd, Virginia Beach, 23454.

You will be given a receipt for your quilt which you should keep safe as you will need to it to retrieve your quilt at the end of the show on Saturday June 8th from 4:30 pm at Cape Henry Collegiate.

We will have some 220 quilts on display as well as over 200 silent auction baskets and another 100 special items to buy or bid on.

We will be offering quilt tours, where you will get a guided tour of specific categories of quilts and learn all about what went into the quilts.

As many of these tireless volunteers are stepping back for a well-deserved rest from guild duties, I would like to thank them for their hard work and dedication over the last few years.



The Quilt Show is nearly here! Yes, there will be a table for book sales, set up near the Silent Auction area.

Any time I mention a book sale, for any Guild event, I'm always asked if we're selling off the Guild library. The answer is NO. The library has existed almost from the beginning, and it will continue. We're keeping the Guild library. So where do all these books come from? Both the library and the book sales are furnished by our members: donations from estates and from downsizing and sorting. Without your generosity, the library would be much smaller. We do buy books from time to time, but the budget is limited. Sometimes we remove books from the collections: duplicate titles, books badly damaged, or if a newer book covers a topic more clearly or thoroughly – those books get pulled, and go to the book sales. I look at everything that you bring in, and there is always a pile of books under consideration near my computer. We can't take everything, and many books brought in we already have in the collection, and that's where the book sales come in. All of the proceeds go directly to the Guild general fund, all of which benefits all of our programs.

So come see the Book Sale table at the show, pick up a treasure or two – the price will be right and we are sure to have something you haven't seen before!

We have 12 vendors at the show as well as an amazing range of door prizes, including a special drawing for 6 door prizes each worth over \$100.

You can make blocks which we will make into quilt tops before donating to charity.

Both the Guild and Quilt Show raffle quilts will be on display and this will be your last chance to buy tickets for the Quilt Show raffle quilt before the drawing at the end of the show on Saturday June 8th.

We still have some slots for the appraiser if you would like to have a quilt appraised. Details are available on the website.

There will also be a food truck and snack shop.








4 Quilt Show Committee Raffle Quilt
