September 1, 2018 Saturday Chapter Meeting minutes

Meeting called to order by Christie Prenger.

Thank you to everyone that pitched in to set up the room for the meeting due to my late arrival. You all truly ROCK!!!

27 Members and no guest attended

No October meeting due to the AQS show.

Member at Large, Betsy Kessler filled in as Secretary, some names were not recorded. If yours was missed, please see Christie Prenger at next meeting, or contact via email at prengerchristie@yahoo.com to be amended into the minutes. We apologize for any exclusions.

Due to our Secretary having to step down, we are currently looking for a new, permanent person to take over. Until such person is found, volunteers are going to fill in each month. Pam Bowen has volunteered to fill in for the November meeting. Thank you Pam, and to Betsy for taking on this role in the meantime.

Quilt Show – Betts Werbiskis thanked everyone who worked and came to the TQG quilt show. The quilt show was a success and thanked Quilt Show committee for a job well done.

AQS Quilt Show – Betts Werbiskis also gave an update on the AQS show to be held Oct. 3-6, 2018. AQS has contracted our guild to provide volunteers for the show and for Oct. 1-2 for set up of the show. We will be providing white glove people (Hostesses) to talk about the quilts and provide information, as no touching of any quilt is allowed at the show. Guild will receive \$1,000 for these 6 days of work from volunteers and also keep any monies made from our Silent Auction, Coat / Baggage check area, and Raffle Quilt. Our quilt will be the ONLY raffle quilt in the entire show. Most shifts are scheduled for 2.5 hours each, and is good for a free admission to the AQ show on the day you volunteer. Those that volunteer for set up get a free admission ticket for one day of their choosing to the show

Block of the Month – Only 6 blocks were turned in this month. We did not get the person's name that won them recorded. All of the Block of the Month blocks will be themed around State names this year, and require a "white" background. Whites, creams, light tans, light beige fabrics – tone –on-tone or other fabrics that read as a solid for background only. You use any fabrics from your stash that you chose for the remainder of the

block fabric requirements. We will hold back one block from each month to be held for a raffle at the end of the 12 month program to make a sampler quilt of all blocks. This is why we ask for "white" backgrounds, to make the sampler quilt have some unifying element. All blocks should be 12.5" square to finish at 12" in a quilt. November's Block will be Arizona #2, pattern on page 17. All patterns are free and can also be found at QuiltersCache.com

Library – Books that are past due need to be turned in so they can be added to the inventory list. Member that fail to return library books on time can be fined a small fee and these fees are due as soon as possible to the Librarian. We ask that you return books in a timely manner so that they are equally available to all member who may be interested in checking them out of the library.

September program - Joanne showed us how to make Microwave fabric bowls.

UFO Challenge – in months past, we discussed continuing the UFO challenge. As of yet, we have not started the program. This is partly because of the changing of the guard so to speak and trying to figure out our new positions. I will bring sign-up sheets to the November and December meetings for both the UFO completed projects and UFO topper only projects. We will have the first projects due at February meeting and every other month following. This will give everyone a chance to figure out which projects they want to complete, as well as time to plan when to complete them

November program will be Fabric Pumpkins. Joanne Parlante will show us how to make stuffed fabric pumpkin table toppers just in time for the holidays. Supplies needed are:

Ongoing Exhibit Change! The Museum will be CLOSED from September 9th to September 17th for the changing of our exhibits!

When we reopen Tuesday September 18th at 10:00 a.m. and will have the following exhibits:



Mountain Mist Quilts - 20th Century Favorites curated by Neva Hart

In 1929, making wall art was not the intention of Stearns & Foster Company of Cincinnati, Ohio when their Mountain Mist batting division started printing quilt designs on the wrappers for its all-cotton quilt batting products. The highly successful marketing strategy to sell batting by giving away pretty quilt patterns with easy-to-use instructions influenced styles of the Colonial Revival period and fostered quiltmaking for almost 90 years. This exhibit features quilts made from some of the earliest Mountain Mist quilt patterns, which have remained favorites into the 21st century.

AQSG Basket Quilts

This traveling exhibit includes 25 quilts made by members of the American Quilt Study Group which have been inspired by a 19th century quilt, quilt top, or block with one or more baskets. Many museums, historical societies, and individuals have given permission for some wonderful quilts in their collection to be used for inspiration.

Sacred Threads curated by Sarah Entsminger

Sacred Threads is an international exhibition of quilts exploring themes of spirituality, joy, inspiration, peace and brotherhood, grief, and healing. The objective is to create a dignified exhibition of artwork that touches all those who view it on both a spiritual and personal level. It serves as a vehicle to share the experiences of quilters whose stories may be a source of healing and strength. From each biennial exhibition, a smaller selection of works that illustrates the purpose of Sacred Threads is chosen to travel to a variety of venues throughout the US for the interim two years.

Treasures From the Vault: This is my Name curated by Gloria Comstock

The signature quilt has been popular, particularly from the Baltimore Album time period (1840-1860). This exhibit elaborates on examples of the various signature quilts that are in the permanent collection of the Virginia Quilt Museum. Selected are quilts that are signed by the quiltmaker or that indicate to whom the quilt was gifted. The advanced technology of ink made it possible for people to write their names on fabric. Many signatures were embroidered as well. These quilts are living documents commemorating the average person.

Viva La Difference by the Apple Valley Needle Threaders, Berryville, VA curated by Nyra White and Pam Pampe

A rare look into an area guild that features an assortment of quilts, quilted clothing, and quilted home objects. Each piece reflects the personality and talent of the maker. Whimsical and authentic in content and variety, this selection serves as inspiration to all who strive to tell their story through needle arts.

October 1-14 - Quilts About Town: A Downtown Quilt Walk:

When you come visit the museum take a leisurely stroll through beautiful downtown Harrisonburg to see more quilts in local shops, restaurants, and museums! This is a free self-guided event. We are working to expand this event to more local business downtown. As we finalize locations, we will put that information on our website.

October 7-21- Online Auction

This is your chance to not only support the museum but collect beautiful items by local artists. The auction will go live in October.

The TQG 2018 Quilt Show Committee conducted their final meeting on September 5th, 2018 where each sub-committee presented their final reports. I want to share with you some of the information provided.

Our numbers for admission ticket sales is \$7,315.00. This breaks down to 731 people paid admission and attended our show. Of the 731, there were 96 people that purchased & turned in the advance ticket vouchers. This number is down from previous quilt shows and we are at a loss as to why because we had excellent advertising! Specifically, there was a full article about our guilt show in the "BEACON" a week prior to the dates of the guilt show. Sometimes, it's just hard to predict.

Our 2 workshops were well received. Augusta Cole's Feathered Star workshop had 8 quilters registered and Sara Madson's Dazzeling Diamonds workshop had 19 quilters registered. We made a profit of \$110.00 on the workshops.

The Special Exhibit of Steve & Karen Albright's collection of antique quilts was very well received! We had 6 quilts registered and displayed in our "Junior Quilters" exhibit. As always, we honored our members who passed in the last 2 years in our Memory Quilts exhibit.

The "Sit & Sew" event was a big hit and having those wonderful Featherweight machines to sew the blocks with was brilliant! Thank you, Sara's Thimble, for lending the Featherweights! There were 68 "Red Cross" blocks sewn, and they will be donated to Quilts of Valor and Project Linus.

There were 214 quilts registered for exhibit at the show. Of those, 81 were judged by NAQS Certified Judge, Beverly Fine. The list of award-winning guilts follows this report.

The Door Prize sub-committee received a little over 200 door prizes from guilt shops, vendors, individuals and guild members to be given out during the 2 days of the quilt show.

The Quilt Show Committee quilt "Black & White & Red All Over" had ticket sales of 1384 at \$1.00 each. After expenses, the committee guilt had a profit of \$1,012.00. The winner of the 2018 committee quilt is Rosemary Rooney! And we couldn't be happier! Congratulations, Rosemary!

There was a total of 13 vendors registered to vend during the guilt show with one vendor canceling at the last minute. Our profit for vendor booth fees was \$2,665.00.

The quilt show challenge to tell your story of what "Home" resonates for you had 15 entries on display for viewer's choice. The challenge winners list follows this report.

A big shout out to The "B" who made all of the award ribbons and they are: Debbie Williams, Chris Walker, Judy Ross, Chris Johnson, Diane Benette, Sandy Reynolds, Trish Pehrson, Charlene Freeland, and Beth Alexander.

The "Silent Auction" was a huge success! To date, it made the largest profit than any other Silent Auction in the history of the guild's guilt shows. Rosemary Rooney & Lyn McCandlish that headed that sub-committee did a marvelous job. Everyone on the guilt show committee and other guild members who came out to Rosemary's to help create the beautiful bundled baskets really shows the creative genius of our members. Thank you to all of our members for your generous donations, as we know there would not be such a fantastic Silent Auction without all of you! How could you resist from purchasing these items? Overall, there were 348 baskets bundled into delicious eye candy, several quilt tops along with some completed quilts, lots and lots of patterns and books available for purchase. Our total profit from the "Silent Auction" is \$6,307.00!! WooHoo! Way to go everyone! I should also mention that we had quilters from other guilds that wanted to know just how we did the baskets, wanted to use our "bidding cards" for a template and also wanted our inside scoop on how we kept inventory and established our price point. We also found out that quilters who are members of other guilds asked about our program booklet and took it to share with their guilds. Some of our committee members jokingly suggested we build a program on how to produce a successful quilt show and travel to other guilds and teach it (hahaha). Anyway, we have an awful lot to be proud about.

Now for the big news! Knowing we have a few paid expenses/bills that we are waiting to clear, I can report we made a very large profit. As of September 5th, we showed a profit of \$7,890.40. This number will undoubtedly change, but we are confident that it will be over or close to \$7,500.00. This is the largest profit ever to be made in the history of TQG's quilt shows. The extreme dedication and hard work of the quilt show committee, all of the volunteers, and everyone that registered a quilt for exhibit made this happen! Congratulations to all TQG members! JOB WELL DONE!

We will officially close out the TQG 2018 quilt show after we reconcile the account, hopefully by the end of October. I want to thank everyone for all of your support, hard work and due diligence as I served you, the TQG membership, as your Quilt Show Officer. It has been an honor! Soon, I am turning over the reins to your new Quilt Show Officer, Cindy Hutton. I encourage your support as the planning gets underway for 2020. Please consider being a member of the quilt show committee for 2020 as it is a great opportunity to serve your guild and to learn/experience something magical!


